

Can a dedicated line bypass a splitter

DSL requires a dedicated line that goes directly from the telephone network interface device (NID) to the DSL modem. This is known as a "home run" wiring setup, as it eliminates the need for any ...

By dividing a single optical signal from a central Optical Line Terminal (OLT) into multiple outputs for Optical Network Terminals (ONTs) at users' homes, splitters eliminate the need for ...

The Filter/Splitter (and your ADSL modem) needs to be connected DIRECTLY to the incoming exchange line and must NOT pass through an In-Line Filter first. All analogue ...

Installing a dedicated circuit isn't as simple as adding another outlet. It requires the right wiring, breaker size, and knowledge of your home's electrical limits.

Using a resistive splitter for a mic signal would generally be considered a very bad idea, because the loss through the splitter means that more gain is needed at the mic preamps so noise is increased ...

The unused lines add loss to the whole system and can especially impact MoCA networking, which is used by both DIRECTV and DISH. If you absolutely must have an unused ...
