

Fiber Optic Cable Tension Protection Requirements

Fiber optic cable is subject to damage if the cable's specified maximum tensile force is exceeded. Except for short runs or hand-pulls, tension must be monitored.

Since building systems may require many types of cables, both fiber and copper, these cables should be separated to protect the fiber cables from damage and all cables marked properly.

Fiber optic cable sequential numbers are required at each pole location and vault wall. Sequential numbers will identify conduit length, and slack left in vaults and at poles.
